

Clinical Supervisors as Leaders in Occupational Therapy



This course is designed to provide the participant with practical leadership strategies for OT student development in the clinic. OTs who are clinical instructors are consistently faced with the challenge of educating students in time constrained and fast-paced situations. In addition, current students present with increasing complexities due to their own professional and personal challenges.

1. Identify and analyze their own leadership style
2. Identify the "Five Leadership Practices"
3. Apply leadership strategies to current clinical supervision cases
4. Relate the leadership strategies to occupational therapy philosophy
